## Off to a flying start!

Thank you to everyone for their efforts in making this week such a positive first week back in school. The phased transition has felt right for the children and also for the staff, providing them with the opportunity to be back together as full classes and settle back into the new routines. The children have been absolutely fantastic! They have been polite, happy, calm and generally very pleased to be back with their friends and teachers. Thank you to everyone for reading the back to school documentation thoroughly and liaising with class teachers so effectively. This has ensured a more smooth and successful transition. We very much look forward to welcoming our new pupils into Nursery and Reception next week. As from Monday, all pupils will move into their new classes.

#### Just a few reminders:

- Please stick to the agreed staggered and finish times for the different year groups. It is important that children arrive at school on time and are dropped straight off to their appropriate entrance.
- If possible, only one parent/carer should drop or collect the children to
  minimise congestion in the yard. Please try not to spend too long
  congregating on the yard area and maintain social distancing at all times. This
  includes after school: unfortunately, we cannot allow families to congregate on
  the yard to play on the field. We are not marking out the school site, rather
  trusting that people will adhere to expectations.
- Please do not park your car by mounting the kerb. We value our relationships with local residents and must always conduct ourselves in a respectful, considerate way. For local families, please try to travel to school on foot.
- Please send freshly washed PE kit in every Monday (Reception-Year 4). We would like the children to still get changed for PE as it encourages independence and good hygiene after exercise. However, all used kit will be sent home for washing on PE day. Children should still come into school every Friday in sportswear for 'Fit Friday'. To clarify, PE kit should be washed every week and returned every Monday. Thank you for your support with this.
- The children only need to bring into school the following items:
  - Water bottle
  - Reading folder
  - PE kit



## Music Lessons

We would like to offer children in Years 2, 3 and 4 the opportunity to learn the following musical instruments with our specialist music teacher, Mr Peacock:

Years 2 and 3: ukulele or keyboard

Year 4: ukulele, keyboard or guitar (only if taught last year and have own guitar)

Mr Peacock will lead lessons every Thursday afternoon costing £5.50 for half an hour (in a group of 3 children). This is a maximum group size due to social distancing and the ability to effectively teach and engage with the children. For ukulele lessons, the children can hire a ukulele that can be taken home to practise on for £5. This hire will be for the full duration of lessons across the year with Mr Peacock.

If you would like your child to receive a lesson, please complete the form that will be sent via Parentmail in the next two days. Please note that payment must be received by Monday 28<sup>th</sup> September for this half term. Should you wish to cancel the lessons, a notice period of 4 weeks should be given and a phone call or email sent to the school office.
