Communication & Language

Listen to the story, learn songs and rhymes, discuss the story, ask and answer questions about what happens, learn some new words linked to the story

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Roleplay the story using costumes, props and small world. Think about feelings throughout the story Keeping safe-Should Goldilocks have gone into the house?, Make some rules of our own to help us keep safe. The bears are angry in the story, how could they calm down? How can we keep calm when angry?

Physical Development

Explore porridge with different spoons and containers, Construct a new bed/chair for Baby Bear. Move like Daddy/Mummy/Baby Bear,.

Literacy

Retell the story with words, story maps and actions. Learn Goldilocks songs and rhymes. Read some non fiction books about bears. Write a letter to Baby Bear from Goldilocks,

Identify representations of 1.2.3. Subitise or count to find how many and make own collections of 1,2,3 objects. Match number names to quantities and numerals. Touch count in different arrangements and recognise the final number is the quantity of the set. Circles and triangles Pattern, Size, Position, Capacity

Understanding the World

Explore porridge oats, and make porridge. Explore the changes, Explore materials to create beds for the three bears. Sort materials

Create a small world area for the bears, explore junk modelling materials to design and build a new chair/bed for Baby Bear, change our role play are into the bears house.
