#### Car Parking...again!

Unfortunately, we find ourselves back in the position of requesting that people travelling to school by car are considerate of residents who live nearby. We have an on-going issue with congestion, people driving too quickly and parking in dangerous locations putting the safety of our families seriously at risk. We have also had complaints recently from residents living in streets where people have even parked in private parking spaces. This is a huge concern. Having consulted with Northumberland County Council, we are discussing the possibility of extending double yellow lines. However, the real solution is to develop a culture of consideration and awareness that if habits do not change, there is going to be a serious accident. I am meeting with the School Council who will be planning a road safety campaign that will include ideas for improving this issue. If there are any solution-focussed parents or carers who are interested in forming a working party to address this issue with myself and try to come up with a plan, I would welcome support and involvement.

## <u>Tanzania Day</u>

Our school **Tanzania Day** will take place on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> February. Children are invited to come into school either wearing the colours of the Tanzania flag (green, yellow, black, blue). Donations of £1 will go towards buying equipment for the nursery of the school who we are supporting. There will also be a bake sale at morning break time. Baking donations are gratefully received and should be brought into school on the actual day. Our student leaders will set up the cakes on stalls and each class will have the opportunity to buy one or two cakes. It would be extremely helpful if children could bring loose change in for the bake sale.
