The funding from Pupil Premium has been used in variety of ways intended to enhance the learning and experiences of pupil premium children. Recognising that different Pupil Premium children have widely differing needs and respond to differing provisions, we ensure we use a variety of approaches. Some of these have been shown through research by the Education Endowment Fund and others to be effective. Others are approaches that our own experiences demonstrate work for us at Seaton Sluice.

#### Impact of Pupil Premium spending

- Increased levels of participation of PP children in our Robinwood visit meaning 100% of children participated overall in 2015 up from 70% in 2013.
- The impact of the one to one and group tuition sessions has been very good with a noticeable rise
  in rise in pupil's self-esteem, confidence in addition to the specific skills focussed on by the intervention.









- A high proportion of pupils in the nurture group have been assessed using a recognised profile prior to and after intervention with very positive results.
- Learning Support Assistants in particular have increased their skills with regard to working on specific areas of the curriculum with groups of pupil. Pupils have benefitted from their expertise with the added impact of good progress across the school.
- Having two extra support assistants working across the school has brought huge benefits to
  pupil premium children allowing support during specific times of the day for particular children
  leading to a positive working and learning environment for the pupils.
- All our pupil premium children made at least expected progress in reading, writing and maths.
- Progress of pupil premium children in reading was accelerated with 100% achieving a level 2b+.

#### 2015/16 spending

Our pupil premium allocation for the current academic year is £23,900

## How we intend to spend our allocation

- Increased support for pupil premium children who perform at just below the expected level
- Fully funded access to the year 4 residential visit to Robinwood
- Teacher input to achieve smaller teaching groups for mental maths in KS2
- Learning Support Assistant time to run a range of focussed intervention groups in literacy, phonics, speaking and listening, numeracy and nurture.
- HLTA delivery of one to one and group tuition for selected pupils
