- ✓ A whole school understanding that we are all unique and valued for who we are with our own special story
- ✓ Modelling of the 'THRIVE' approach to promoting effective relationships and creating a culture of trust and respect
- ✓ A recognition that inclusion is not about ignoring differences...but rather embracing differences

Embedding our inclusive culture is a commitment for us as a school. Furthermore, we are very much looking forward to welcoming up to eight pupils from outside of our catchment area who will join 'The Lighthouse' class, managed by Mrs Walsh who is our school Special Educational Needs Coordinator.
