### Middle School Applications

#### A POLITE REMINDER TO YEAR 4 PARENTS.

The online portal for admissions continues to be open and can be accessed via Northumberland County Council's website, under 'school admissions'. Parents with children who are currently in Year 4 **MUST** apply for a place at their chosen middle school. It is not



an automatic transfer process from first to middle school. The closing date for all applications is <u>31<sup>st</sup> October 2017</u>. Please be aware that if you do not apply for the school of your choice, you are **unlikely** to secure a place for your child to begin middle school in September 2018.

Can we also remind you that there will be an open evening at Seaton Sluice Middle School on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October at 7:30pm. You will hopefully have received information on this from the middle school.

#### Phonics Meeting For Reception

Mrs Mays and Mrs Elliott would like to invite parents and carers of children in Reception to attend a Phonics Meeting. These meetings provide an opportunity to share with you the school's approach to delivering phonics which is key to their success in the first stages of reading. Parents are invited to attend one of the meetings where there will be the chance to look at some of the resources used to deliver the curriculum and ideas on how you can further support learning at home. Please remember that as a school we believe that reading is the most important aspect of homework that you can support your child with at home. The meetings will take place on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> October at either 2:30pm or 6pm and will last approximately 45 minutes maximum. Your support is greatly appreciated.
