Social networking sites

Bumped Heads in school

In the case of more serious bumps to the head children are treated by a trained first aider and parents are notified so that they can take further action if they wish e.g. check with walk in clinic or casualty. More minor bumps are recorded and your child may come home with an orange sticker that says they have had a bump on that day.

School Lunches

We and North Tyneside are delighted with the current uptake of school meals. Since changing the school that cooks the meals for us we have had very positive feedback about the quality of the food. The children seem to be really enjoying their lunches. It is so much better to be able to have a choice for their school meals and we are very grateful to all parents and carers who take the time to sit down with their children to discuss their choices from the menus. We are well aware that children can change their minds about what they want to eat and that they can like something one day and not the next. We must stress though that the request to only make changes to the menu after the first 3 weeks of a new menu be understood and accepted by parents and children. I understand that it is a worry and a concern that your child may be having very little to eat at lunchtime if they have told you that they don't like something. The reality is that there is usually a wide variety of food available and we can offer all sorts to fill them up on those days. There is a full salad bar including pasta and bread most days and puddings to offer every day.

Coats

We have children arriving in school without a coat. At this time of year the rule is that unless staff says otherwise coats are to be worn at every playtime. Please ensure that your child wears a coat to school.
