Note for parents

Most weeks a spelling pattern will be taught in school. The words listed here are examples that fit the pattern we are exploring in class. The weekly spelling test will include these words plus 5 that fit the pattern but are not known in advance.

We hope that testing the rule rather than learning a list of words by rote, will help your child to spell well in their writing across the curriculum.
